Recycle Program



Kountree Kampinn now has a fully functional recycle program and as good stewards of our environment we are asking each and every resident to participate. The recycle facilities are all located near the trash dumpster.

Aluminum cans – please place all aluminum cans in the appropriately marked barrels provided just inside the dumpster fence. The proceeds from the recycling of this material will be returned to the recreational fund in the park. Miscellaneous aluminum material (lawn chairs, siding pieces, etc) should be left near the dumpster for the park employees to recycle.



Glass, tin cans, and plastic – Place glass bottles and jars, tin cans, and all numbered plastics (# 1 – 7) in the container so marked for co-mingled recycle material.

Plastic material that has no number and Styrofoam have no recycle value and can be placed in the trash dumpster. Please **FLATTEN** all containers of significant size to conserve space in the recycle bins.

Newspaper, junk mail, office paper and magazines - all of these materials should be placed in the large red newspaper dumpster. Please **DO NOT** place any cardboard or plastic in this dumpster.

Magazines - Magazines in good condition (with your address removed) may be placed in the shelves near the newspaper bin for others to enjoy. This is the best form of recycling.

Cardboard – Cardboard is being recycled by park volunteers. Please place clean cardboard in the bin behind the fence. Please flatten your boxes so that they don't take excessive space. Dirty cardboard (i.e. greasy pizza boxes) are not useable for recycling and should be placed in the trash dumpster.

Electronics and small appliances – In season (November through April) these items may be placed behind the fence. Local volunteers will carry these items to the Collier County recycling facility for proper disposal and recycling.

Small propane tanks – In season (November through April) these small empty propane tanks should be left on the ground inside the fence. Volunteers will carry these to the Collier County recycling facility for proper disposal and recycling.
